While ECH1 students take a closer look at inspirations from the natural world, Year Ones (lower left) draw connections between sustainability and structures to design their own Earthship-style home. ECH2 students (lower right) tell stories in the style of Vietnamese 'Hmong' quiltmakers, while Year Fours (upper left) engage in storytelling using stop-motion animation technology.

Year 5 students, meanwhile, are engaged in the capstone project of the Primary Years Programme, the Exhibition. In Visual Arts, they are designing an original art piece as part of their inquiry. In their work, students demonstrate conceptual links to their Central Idea and other Exhibition components.
